1. EVENT NAME: LICENCE TO KILL: LASER WAR

EVENT DATES: 18th, 19th & 20th September 2019

The laser war match was between two teams. Each team was consisting of 3 players. The time duration for each match was five minutes. Jackets were provided to each player along with a laser gun. The jackets contained photo diode plate, a buzzer, five LED strips, Arduino, batteries, relay, 9V to 12V converter circuit, etc. All these were mounted on each individual jacket. When the player hit the photo-diode plate using the laser gun, the LED would glow and buzzer would start sounding. There were maximum five shots allowed to single player. When all LEDs from jacket were lighted, that player would then be considered dead; he/she would not able to operate laser gun from thereon, meaning laser gun would automatically switch off by tripping the relay. The winner was decided according to the count of remaining shots per player in a single team.


